CELEBRATING 50 YEARS OF LOCAL GOVERNMENT

On April 1st, hundreds of councils across the country created under the Local Government Act 1972 celebrated their 50th anniversary.

The act brought major changes to the local government system and reduced the number of councils from 1,245 to 412 from 1 April 1974. There are now 217 principle councils in England.

This anniversary is an opportunity to celebrate the achievements local authorities have made over that time, and those who have served local residents throughout that time.

COMMUNITIES FOR AFGHANS

DLUHC is working with partners to develop and test an Afghan sponsorship project, modelled on the existing Community Sponsorship scheme.

This project will support the resettlement of households eligible for Pathway 3 of the Afghan Citizens Resettlement Scheme (ACRS) to the UK.

EMC COMMUNICATIONS NETWORK: PRE-ELECTION PERIOD ADVICE
