A NEW MAYOR FOR THE EAST MIDLANDS

Yesterday, voters across Derbyshire and Nottinghamshire were given the opportunity to vote for the first Mayor of the East Midlands Combined County Authority (EMCCA).

Following a turn-out of 27.6% overall, with the highest turnout in Rushcliffe (37.7%) and lowest in Bolsover (22.3%), at the time of writing it seems likely that Claire Ward (Labour) will be announced as the new Mayor of the EMCCA, and will start their duties next week.

The devolution deal for the EMCCA was signed by all four upper tier councils in November 2022, guaranteeing a funding stream of £1.14billion, spread over a 30-year period, alongside devolved powers around transport, housing, skills and adult education, economic development and net zero. East Midlands Councils is looking forward to working closely with the new Mayor and authority to ensure

that our priorities as a wider region are aligned.

Across the rest of the East Midlands, elections were taking place for Police and Crime Commissioners. Conservative Marc Jones has been re-elected as Police and Crime Commissioner (PCC) for Lincolnshire for a third term. Rupert Matthews has been re-elected as Police and Crime Commissioner (PCC) for Leicestershire and Rutland. The results for the PCC elections in Derbyshire, Northamptonshire and Nottinghamshire are still to be announced.

In Lincoln, there were elections for 11 seats, one from each of the wards in the City. Labour retained control where a third of the sears were up for grabs last night. The Labour Party won 8 seats, the Lib Dems won 2 and the Conservatives won 1.
