# HITTING THE GROUND RUNNING – WORKSHOP FOR NEWLY ELECTED COUNCILLORS FRIDAY 11 JULY 2025 | 2PM-4.30PM

### **EMC GENERAL MEETING**

The East Midlands Councils Annual General Meeting will be taking place on Friday 11th July 2025, and will be held at Newark & Sherwood DC, Castle House, Newark, NG24 1BY. Registration will commence from 9am, with political pre-meetings taking place at 9.30am. The AGM will begin at 10am, concluding with lunch at midday.

### MIDLANDS RAIL HUB PLANS FOR EAST MIDLANDS 'PUT ON HOLD'

Plans to deliver the £1.7 billion Midlands Rail Hub, aimed at improving connectivity and services across both the East and West Midlands, have been scaled back following the Chancellor's Spending Review. While the government has reaffirmed investment in "critical national infrastructure" and committed to progressing the "Midlands Rail Hub West" phase, improvements for the East Midlands are not included in the initial delivery stage.

The revised plans focus on enhancements in Birmingham and the West Midlands, including the construction of the West Chord at Bordesley and upgrades to King's Norton Station. Work on the East Midlands phase continues at a development level but has not yet secured funding for delivery, raising concerns about long-term connectivity and capacity improvements for the region.

### REFORMS TO THE IMMIGRATION SYSTEM INTRODUCED

New rules to be laid in Parliament will see skills and salary thresholds rise, overseas recruitment for care workers end, and more than 100 occupations no longer granted access to the immigration system. These changes, the first to be rolled out from the Immigration White Paper, represent a shift in the UK's approach to immigration. An interim, time-limited and conditional temporary shortage list will be introduced, with international recruitment only providing support where occupations are key to the industrial strategy or building crucial infrastructure.

Each sector must have a workforce strategy in place to train UK workers, or it will lose access to the immigration system.
